Purpose Statement

The Center for Integrated Healthcare Integrating Mental Health and Primary Care Services: Blending Co-located Collaborative Care and Care Management conference will provide skilldevelopment training for providers working in co-located, collaborative Primary Care-Mental Health Integration (PC-MHI) programs. This practical training will cover the basics of PC-MHI integration, evidence-based skills needed for successful Co-located Collaborative Care (CCC), blending CCC with management, supervision of Care Managers and consulting with Primary Care Providers. The program will focus on blending CCC and care management model; individuals who need skills-based training to work as BHL or TIDES care managers should attend the workshops offered by these programs. Target Audience

Mental Health and Primary Care Leadership, Administrators, Frontline Clinicians including, but not limited to: Physicians, Psychologists, Social Workers, Nurses, Nurse Practitioners, Clinical Pharmacists, Physician Assistants and other advanced practice professionals.
